Digital Footprints

A digital footprint can be traces of a person or footprints people leave online such as texts, emails, videos, digital images or other transmission of information

Think about all of your online interactions: banking, paying bills, purchases, messages...

Concerns for Parents and School Personnel:

Online predators: target both boys and girls on the internet and take advantage since they can be whoever they want. They befriend the victim and empathize with them building a relationship and trust.

Sexting: sending explicit images, texts and or emails by using a cell phone or other mobile device

Cyberbullying: usage of electronic technology includes devices and equipment such as cell phones, computers and tablets as well as communication tools including social media sites, texts, chat and websites■

Preventing Cyberbullying/Promoting Safety:

Encourage students to only contact people they know

Check to see what your student is doing online

Monitor text messages on a regular basis
